General Business

- Meeting Minutes October 7, 2022 – Approved with addition of full EDAC Annual Report and change to note that the annual report legislative verbiage was approved.

30 Minutes	OFFP-149 LEA and School-Level Participation in ESSER Activities (New)	Tina Negley, Nazanin
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Overview:

All LEAs that have accepted Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds are required to submit a report to the U.S. Department of Education pertaining to uses of funds. CDE is able to meet the vast majority of the reporting requirements using information collected by CDE through the ESSER I, ESSER II, and ESSER III Applications for Funds, but additional information regarding student participation in evidence-based interventions is needed to fully meet these reporting requirements on behalf of our LEAs.

Discussion: With all that a district is having to post to their websites, is this a duplication of a lot of what districts are already doing? What is different here from what is already asked for? Although LEA's already report on types, these descriptions do not contain the detail that the federal government is requiring regarding how many students were eligible to participate. The applications give insight, but don't give the detailed breakdown by student group to meet CDE's requirements to report the US Department of Education.

The level of detail is on the quantity of service against the numbers that were budgeted for. The US Department of Education is requiring CDE to breakdown participation by group.

Is this a multi year collection, or only for 2022-23? The US Department of Education's intent is starting from 2022-23, to have to annual report this until the conclusion of the ESSER sub grant.

This is merely being distributed in January so that LEA's will be aware of the need to submit the form by the September due date.

The specificity seems like it will be a major time sink. The questions have been taken directly from the US Department of Education's mandatory reporting template. CDE is only collecting the information as required from the US Department of Education.

Why the Google format and not a spreadsheet upload? CDE has an Excel format as well. CDE's plan is to have a variety of formats for districts to use.

Is this going to be done at the school or district level? The US Department of Education is requiring this to be completed at the sub-grantee level.

Did the State push back on the US DOE on this? Yes, there was national pushback on the excessive nature of this collection and time commitment. The feedback from US DOE was that billions of dollars were invested in education, and they want feedback and information on ROI.

Can districts just tag students they know are using these funds and submit this list? It would be much less burdensome.

Is this just for the allocations we are spending in 2022-23? Yes, it is focused on just spending for this year.

The spreadsheet could be paired down, and there could be an option for districts to just submit a list of students.

The Innovative Learning Opportunities Pilot (ILOP) was created by SB 19-216, and the first cohort started in the fall of 2020. Many of the districts that applied wrote Innovative Learning Plans that were specific to addressing student needs following remote learning in spring 2020. Since then I have heard from the field that they are interested in updating their Innovative Learning Plans, as well as adding new schools to the plan (that may not have existed when the original application was submitted), and adding new partnerships with businesses. The Innovative Learning Plans evolve over time and the field has requested the opportunity to make updates.
