## A Resolution:

## IN SUPPORT OF THE COLORADO READING FIRST MODEL

WHEREAS:	The Colorado Reading First federal grant program (Title I, Part B) has been funded in Colorado since the initial grant in 2002, using scientifically based reading research practices with K-3 <sup>rd</sup> grade students to achieve the goal that all students shall be reading on grade level by the end of 3 <sup>rd</sup> grade; and
WHEREAS:	Colorado Reading First has touched 91 of the 956 elementary schools in Colorado, including 49 currently funded schools, representing 35 districts; and
WHEREAS:	The data to date in Colorado Reading First currently funded schools reflects a 5% gain in students scoring proficient or advanced on CSAP over two years of implementation with K-3 <sup>rd</sup> grade students in some of the most challenged schools in the state; and
WHEREAS:	The Reading First program has sustained a cut in appropriations at the federal level, of 62% for the academic year, 2008-2009.
BE IT RESOLVED	That the Colorado State Board of Education fully endorses the Colorado Reading First model, as an example of a Response to Intervention reform effort that is working in Colorado for

some of our most challenged students.
